

Member survey: should we change the name “Accessibility Standing Group” or not?

I. Intro

As the Accessibility Standing Group (ASG) grows the distinction between **Accessibility** and **Access** becomes not readily understood! To remove that confusion, the ASG has brainstormed two solutions:

1. Change the name to “**Disability Standing Group**”
2. Keep the name “**Accessibility Standing Group**”, but with a slogan that highlights our mission.

This survey is conducted to hear the members’ opinions about these proposals, as well as collect their suggestions. The survey also aimed to learn more about the members’ particular area of accessibility interest or expertise. The survey was conducted from October 20, 2023 00:01 to November 10, 2023 at 23:59 UTC.

II. Key takeaways

- The survey targeted all the ASG members.
- Total responses: **46**
- Total countries of respondents: **27**
- The majority of respondents (**67%**) is in favor of keeping the name Accessibility Standing Group and adding a slogan to describe our mission.
- Only **30%** of respondents claim to have accessibility expertise. But most of these 30% have deep working experience in accessibility.
- **13%** of respondents claim to have a disability.
- All the respondents would like to volunteer for the Standing Group's activities. They would like to volunteer in the followings (from most to least selected):

- Information sharing,
- Social media/promotion,
- Leadership
- Training
- The respondents are almost all ready to devote time to the ASG activities and **90%** of them are ready to devote more than 1hour/week. Some of them are ready to devote 100% of their time.
- Some proposals of slogan:
 - Empower the Disabled, Be Their Voice Worldwide
 - Standing by people with disabilities
 - Raising awareness of and embracing disabilities
 - Campaigning for a happy life with disability

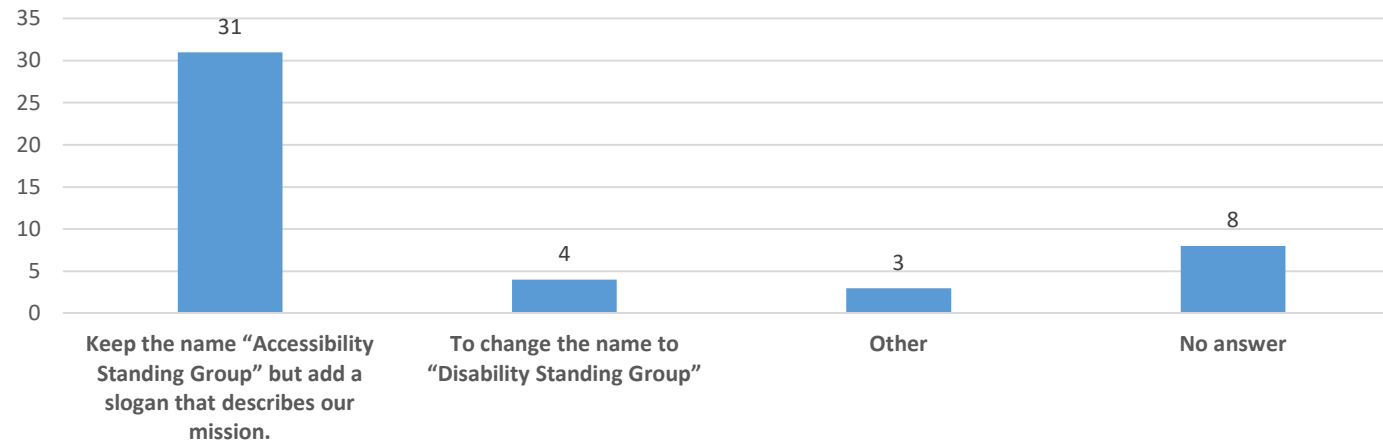

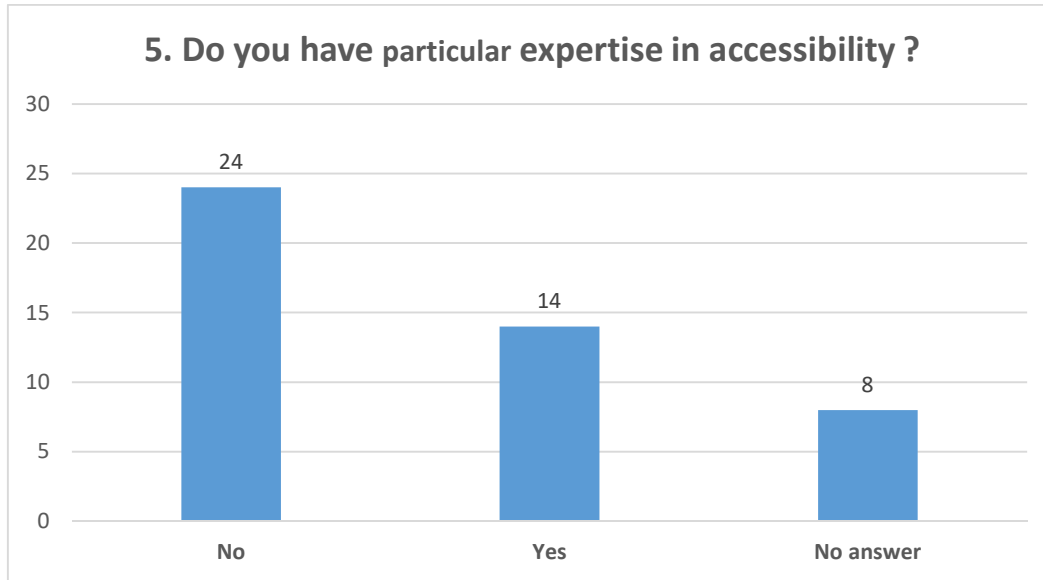

Accessibility is needed for people who do not fit into the concept of disability, such as the elderly.

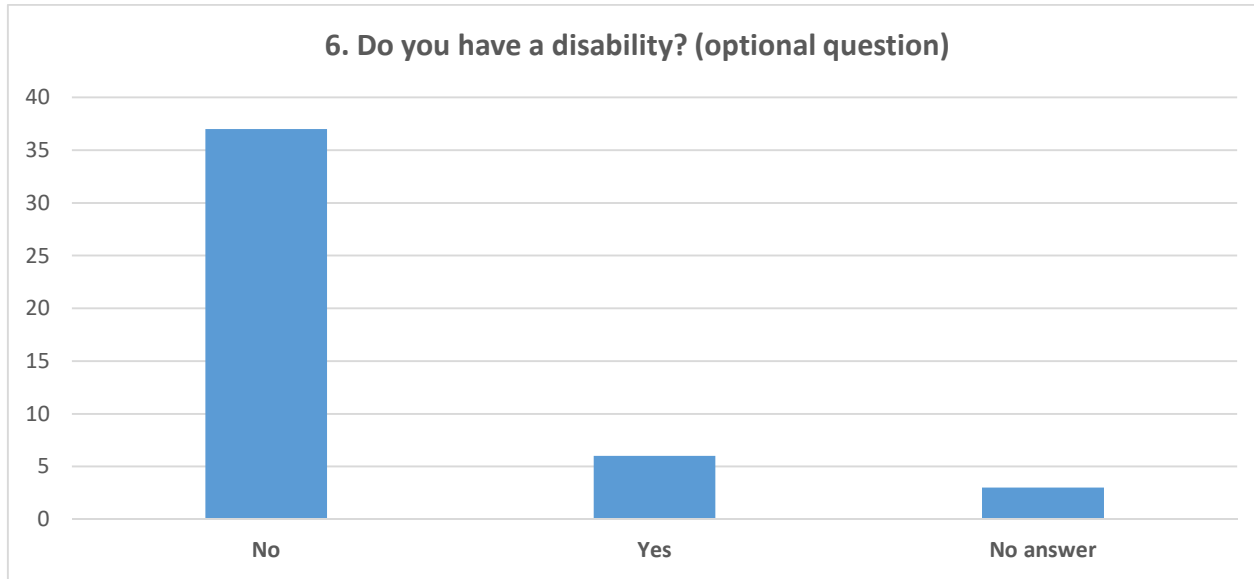
I propose the name: Access for all. I think that accessibility is included there.

workshops and trainings to developers and other teams of companies state and organizations and we carry out accessibility audits of both websites and mobile Apps.
I am adding accessibility information about a place on Google maps. The place is accessible for the disabled peoples or not accessible for disabled peoples especially for wheelchair users.
I am an ICT accessibility and equality consultant working towards promoting Digital Accessibility for persons with disability in Kenya and globally.
I did research on accessibility and developed a policy brief, a scorecard on accessibility of government websites in Kenya.
I have been promoting digital accessibility since 1995. I coordinate the working group on Internet accessibility of Subcommittee 8 of the Technical Standardization Group 139 of AENOR. I participated in a Good Standing situation in the drafting of WCAG 1.0. I have been invited as an expert in several W3C-WAI working groups. I am the creator of the Sidar Foundation - Universal Access, which promotes accessibility in the Ibero-American sphere. I am R&D Manager of Accessibility Support of the aDeNu Research Group of the Artificial Intelligence Department of the National University of Distance Education (UNED).
My research on vulnerable people's digital inclusion involves people with disabilities and my publications on people with disabilities touch upon and explore the issue of accessibility, among others. I'm also working on the establishment of a new IAMCR working group on people with disabilities and their inclusivity and I'll co-chair this group when it's launched - expected date of official announcement of this group will be June 2024.

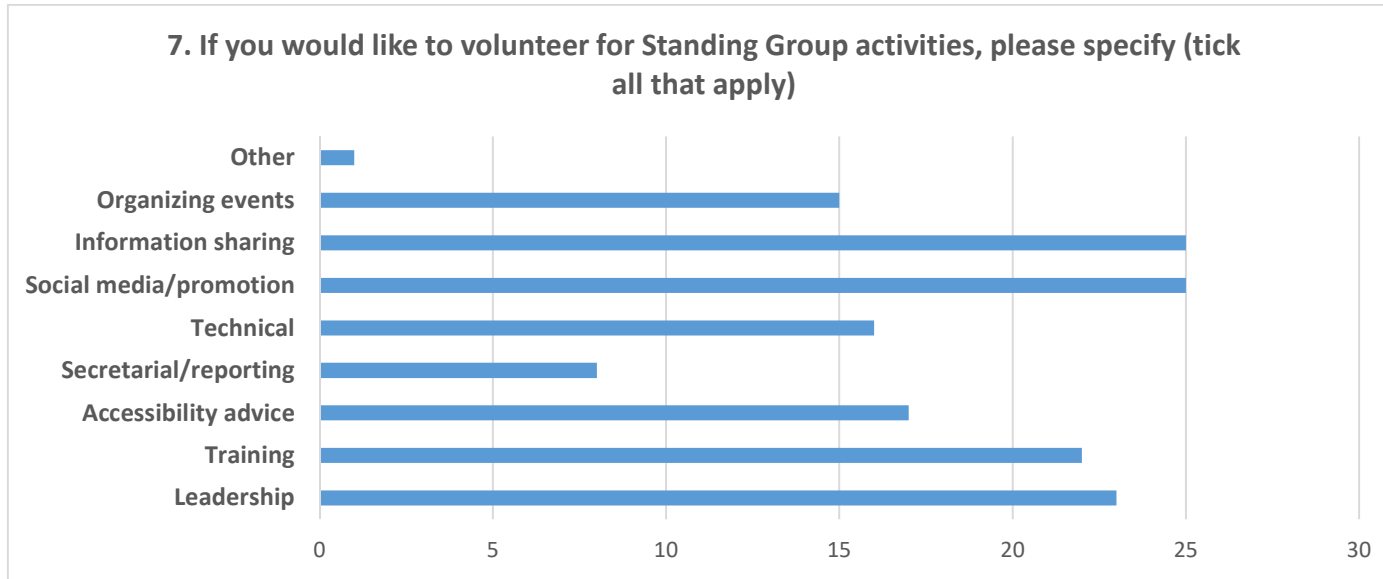

My recommendation would be to use the term "Web Accessibility Standing Group" as opposed to "Accessibility Standing Group." The term "accessibility" can be ambiguous to those not familiar with the field, often being interpreted as either physical accessibility or general online access to material content. Using "Web Accessibility Group" offers clearer context and specificity, particularly emphasizing the focus on making web resources more accessible to all, including those with disabilities.

Sometimes a barrier that hinders participation in the group is the language barrier, because although I can read and write basic English, I am not an English speaker and sometimes the naturalization that English is the only and universal language makes people from developing countries that even because of the same disability we did not have access to good language training, we participate at a disadvantage in these spaces.
Technology Inclusive Accessibility Support Group
